Assessment Methods

1. Course Exams

As a means to measure the effectiveness of the institution, the professors are required to give exams and quizzes throughout their courses. The results of the exams and quizzes given by the professors serve as an indicator of the progress made by the students. It is expected that an exam will be administered during Mid-Terms and Finals.

2. Standardized Tests

Standardized tests will be utilized to assess the academic endeavors of the institution. These tests allow the institution to observe the academic progress of each student among their peers within the institution and with students from other institutions of Biblical higher education. The results of these tests also serve as a means for measuring the effectiveness of the institution.

3. Surveys
